

We have spent the last few weeks talking about brokenness, both in the world around us and in our personal lives. During today's Easter message, we are reminded that brokenness does not have the final say. The resurrection of Jesus set in motion a new hope and a new reality. One that takes our brokenness and transforms us into new creations.



This following study is based on Luke 24:13-34

- 1. From this story, how quickly can we assume the news of empty tomb spread?
- 2. We are told in verse 16 that when Jesus joined the two walking on the road, God intentionally prevented them from recognizing Jesus. Why would God do that?
- 3. Who do the two disciples blame for crucifying Jesus? Who do they leave out?
- 4. Verse 21 reflects the Messianic expectations of two disciples. Were their expectations correct?

- 5. How does Jesus rebuke them and how does he correct their expectations?
- 6. What do we learn about the Old Testament (Moses and the prophets) from this story?
- 7. God opens the eyes of the disciples to recognize Jesus when he is breaking bread with them. Why would you suppose God waited for this moment?
- 8. From the message, why is verse 32 pivotal to the story?
- 9. Four points were given in the message, what were they and discuss each.
