Life Group Study Notes

Study based on Luke 19:11-27 - October 9, 2016

Everything in our world seems to be moving faster – instant this and high speed that, and while speed certainly has its advantages, it can also lead us to lose clarity as everything around us becomes a blur.

In this message we find Jesus telling a story in order to clarify a misconception about the coming of God's Kingdom because what people were expecting and the reality of what was unfolding were two totally different things.

Jesus uses an elaborate political story to reveal an important truth about the Kingdom of God and what it means to trust in God and live by faith.
