Study based on Luke 16:1-8 - October 23, 2016

What if we learned to leverage all we had in a way that truly changes the world for the better?

In this message we find Jesus telling the story of an unscrupulous manager. At first glance it appears that Jesus is commending the dishonesty of the manager and using it as an example of how to

get ahead. But in classic fashion, Jesus uses the story to reveal a more profound truth-one that we often forget.

Jesus uses a simple story to illustrate a timeless truth about God, and the expectations that are part of being a Christ-follower.
