Life Group Study Notes

Study based on Matthew 17:14-21 – *May 7, 2017*

Some consider it a leap in the dark, while others treat it as the remedy for sickness and poverty.

Regardless, a life of faith can still be a life of difficulty. How then, do we manage the expectations that faith is a magic potion for curing all of life's ills?



In this message we look at a story where faith becomes the determining factor for one of Jesus' miracles.

Study - Discovering What the Bible Says



- 1. What is one thing that stood out for you from last week's study?
- 2. When did you come to faith and what was it that influenced you to believe?
- 3. What is an area of belief you struggle with the most? Why?

4. What was presented in the message as a rule for whenever you come across a difficult passage?

Read Matthew 17:14-21 (If time permits read Mark 9:14-29 for more of the story)

- 5. What other reasons could there be for the disciple's inability to heal the boy? Would you have predicted a lack of faith?
- 6. Jesus' reaction to the failure of the disciples goes beyond them to the failure of the entire generation of people within earshot. What made Jesus react in this way?
- 7. How dramatic is the healing of the boy by Jesus?
- 8. What does this passage teach concerning the connection between the spiritual and the physical?
- 9. Verses 19-20 are some of the most difficult verses to understand. What potential problems could arise from mishandling this passage?
